Youth Hostel Hormersdorf

Actually, the youth hostel is located outside of Hormersdorf [!], in the forest near artificial lake and resort "Greifenbachstauweiher". There are simple rooms with 2 to 6 beds.

Competition rules

The competition will be held according the international rules for Youth ARDF championships on the 144 MHz and 3.5 MHz band for the categories W15 and M15 with ranking of indidividuals and teams. Only competitors born in 1992 or later are allowed to participate.

Fees

Competitors, Officials, Visitors: 150 Euro per person in total

The fees cover accommodation, bed linen and full board.
